

## POOL RULES

Pool spring opening and fall closing dates are announced annually by the Board of Directors and posted on the Burnt Hickory Registry Neighborhood Facebook page.

## HOURS: Sunday – Thursday 7 a.m. – 10 p.m. Friday – Saturday 7 a.m. – 11 p.m.

- 1. The pool and facilities are for the use of BHR homeowners and their family and guest.
- 2. Use of the pool is "SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK."
- 3. Children are the responsibility of the parent or guardian. Young children must be accompanied by a responsible guardian.
- 4. Pool gates must remain closed as a condition of our Cobb County permit to operate the pool. Do not prop the gates open.
- 5. Residents are responsible for cleaning and straightening their tables and chairs.
- 6. Umbrellas should be lowered after use.
- 7. Properly dispose of trash in receptacles and clean up your own spills.
- 8. No glass containers of any kind are permitted in the pool area.
- 9. The use of toys and flotation devices will be at the discretion of responsible adults at the pool. During crowded periods or if safety concerns arise, residents may be asked to remove these items from the pool area.
- 10. No pets are allowed within the pool gates.
- 11. Bicycles, skateboards, rollerblades or other similar equipment are not allowed within pool gates.
- 12. No running, roughhousing, or dunking is permitted in the pool facility. Excessive or disruptive splashing is not permitted. No running jumps or dives are allowed into the pool.
- 13. Disruptive screaming, language or music that is loud, abusive, or harassing in nature is not allowed.
- 14. Please attire young children in proper swim diapers. Synthetic/disposable diapers can disintegrate and leave debris in the pool and may cause the pool to be closed for disinfecting.
- 15. Evacuate all pool areas when thunder/lightning storms are present, including the pools, pavilion, and restrooms. Go home or to a safe vehicle and remain there until at least 30 minutes after last thunder is heard.
- 16. The pool company or board of directors will have the authority to close the pool when necessary.
- 17. Pool privileges may be suspended to residents who are not current with HOA dues or assessments.
- 18. BHR will not be responsible for items left in or around the pool area. Items found will be placed to the side in the pavilion area for a few days and then disposed of.
